Check the village website for regulations on recreational fires in the Village Limits. Go to www.villageofwebberville.com There is a button in the middle of the home page that says ordinances click it and it will take you to American Legal Publishing where you can type RECREATIONAL FIRES (or BRUSH- this will take you right to the correct page) it will bring up a list of pages and you are going to want to choose Chapter 50 – the ordinance is 50.07. You can also get a copy from the Village Office.

Spring Reminders:

- **If you have delinquent utility bills prior to December 31, 2019 or any delinquent permits, invoices or code enforcement balances, they will be placed on the 2020 tax bill as of June 2020. Village 2020 tax bills will be out July 1.**
- Chapter 71 of the Village Code of Ordinances prohibits the use of skateboards, bicycles, rollerblades, etc. on any public sidewalk on Main St. between Cherry St. and Chestnut St. on the East side and between Cherry St. and the Municipal Parking lot on the West side. Also use on Grand River Ave. between Clark St. and S. Howard St and in any municipal parking lot is prohibited.
- Any noxious weeds higher than 8 inches in height are a violation of Chapter 91 of the Village Code of Ordinances. If violations are not corrected in the given time frame the Village DPW will take care of it and the owner will be billed for services and a fine.
- Please be kind to your neighbors and your community by cleaning up after your pets, keeping them on a leash and keeping them on your property.
- It looks like spring has sprung....it is a good time to do property maintenance and clean up.

2020 Leaf Pick Up Schedule:

April 13th

Pick up will be scheduled for these days but due to unforeseen circumstances the pick-up may happen at any time during that week.

Rules to leaf pick up can be found at www.villageofwebberville.com and type leaf pick up in the search engine.

1. Rake leaves to the edge of the street, not in the street. If we cannot reach them with the vacuum hose we will not be able to pick them up.
2. Do not make leaf piles wider than (4') four feet wide or we cannot reach them all.
3. Do not rake leaves around posts, signs, mailboxes or cars keep them at least (4') four feet away from all objects.
4. Do not pile them at intersections where we will have to block traffic to pick them up.
5. Do not mix trash, sticks, rocks or other debris with leaves as it will cause damage to the leaf vacuum and/or injury.
6. Do not pile brush and leaves together we cannot sort it for you.
7. Do not put leaves in bags we do not pick up bags.

Brush Pick Up Rules:

Brush pick up will be done one day during the week. Starting at 7a.m. Once the truck goes by it will not be back until the next scheduled pick up.

1. Place brush between the sidewalk and the road (or next to the pavement of the road if no sidewalk). None in the road or extending over the sidewalk.
2. Brush should not be placed by the road prior to the Friday preceding pick up.
3. Place brush with the cut end towards the road.
4. Brush must be piled neatly.
5. Brush may not exceed 5 inches in diameter and /or eight feet in length.
6. There shall be no garden waste (most garden waste can be cut in 6 inch strips and picked up with leaf pick up).
7. There shall be no lumber, roots, concrete, stones, poison ivy or feces mixed with the brush.

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION
