Utility Bills and other payments to the Village can be made online, dropped in the drop box, mailed or we can accept them at the office with a phone call and you can slide your items under the door. We are currently not shutting utilities off for non-payment - but we do want to make sure that it is understood that when this pandemic is over, we will be sending a notice and then red tagging and shut offs will occur

Spring Reminders:

- **If you have delinquent utility bills prior to December 31, 2020 or any delinquent permits, invoices or code enforcement balances, they will be placed on the 2021 tax bill as of June 2021. Village 2021 tax bills will be out July 1.**
- Chapter 71 of the Village Code of Ordinances prohibits the use of skateboards, bicycles, rollerblades, etc. on any public sidewalk on Main St. between Cherry St. and Chestnut St. on the East side and between Cherry St. and the Municipal Parking lot on the West side. Also use on Grand River Ave. between Clark St. and S. Howard St and in any municipal parking lot is prohibited.
- Any noxious weeds higher than 8 inches in height are a violation of Chapter 91 of the Village Code of Ordinances. If violations are not corrected in the given time frame the Village DPW will take care of it and the owner will be billed for services and a fine.
- Please be kind to your neighbors and your community by cleaning up after your pets, keeping them on a leash and keeping them on your property.
- It looks like spring has sprung...it is a good time to do property maintenance and clean up.
