Tip of the Month: Did you ever wonder what the abbreviations on your utility bill stand for? Below is a guide for those abbreviations.

PB: Previous Balance
WA: Water Usage Based on Meter Reading
SW: Sewer Usage Based on Water Usage
WD: Water Ready to Serve
SD: Sewer Ready to Serve
TR: Trash, brush & leaf collection

RT: Red Tag
NSF: Non-Sufficient Funds
RW: Reconnect Water
DW: Disconnect Water

Bills go out on the 1st.
Bills are due on the 20th.
Red Tags are \$25 and are hung 3-5 days prior to shut off date. If you do not receive a bill in the mail – it is your responsibility to acquire one.

NOTICE: In early November the "timer" for the noon siren at NIESA Fire Station 62, located in the Village of Webberville at the corner of Elm Rd. and W. Walnut St., ceased to function. The timer and the siren are over seventy years old. The timer cannot be repaired. Parts cannot be found to repair it. Therefore, there will no longer be the sound of a siren at noon, seven days a week, to let you know it is lunch time. The siren itself is still manually functional, and will continue to be used for emergencies such as tornado warnings, etc. The siren is considered to be mechanical, and when it fails to function anymore, it will have to be replaced with an electronic siren at an extensive cost close to \$5,000. Hopefully that cost is years away. Please enjoy the silence at noon for now on. I sure will. I live right next to the siren.

Granger observes the following major holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. When one of these holidays falls on a weekday, there will be no service on that day. Additionally, service will be delayed by one day for the rest of the week and Friday collections will take place on Saturday. When one of these holidays falls on a weekend, there is no delay to service. The Village of Webberville will have pick up on December 23rd and the 30th.



Winter Reminders:

Ordinance No. 155 stipulates snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours after it has ceased, if the accumulation is less than 4 inches. Snow & Ice must be removed within 48 hours after it has ceased, if accumulation is more than 4 inches. If you would like to apply for an exemption from this Ordinance, please contact the Village Office or come in and fill out the request (it must be approved annually by a Council decision)..

Parking is prohibited on any Village Street or parking lot from the hours of 3:00-6:00 a.m.



The Village Office and D.P.W. will be **closed on the following days:** Thursday, December 24th, Friday, December 25th, Thursday, December 31st, and Friday, January 1st in observance of Christmas and New Year's. The Village Council and Staff wish you happy holidays!

Due to COVID 19 the Annual Christmas tree lighting and Light Parade have been cancelled – there may be a special video coming out to substitute for these events. Look for information on the website, under notices or call and ask the Village Office.

WITH THE WINTER SEASON UPON US PLEASE MAKE SURE TO REMOVE YOUR CURBSIDE TRASH CONTAINERS. THE VILLAGE WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGED CONTAINERS THAT ARE LEFT NEXT TO THE ROAD. CONTAINERS SHOULD NOT BE AT CURBSIDE UNTIL THE NIGHT BEFORE TRASH PICK-UP AND SHOULD BE REMOVED BY 7 A.M. THE MORNING AFTER PICK – UP. WE APPRECIATE YOUR COOPERATION IN THIS FOR PLOWING PURPOSES. GRANGER MAY CHARGE A FEE TO REPLACE DAMAGED CONTAINERS. THE VILLAGE WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY FEES INCURRED DUE TO ANY DAMAGE CAUSED TO CONTAINERS LEFT BY THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ANY TIME.
