2020 Brush Pick Up Schedule:

May 4th
June 1st
July 6th
August 3rd

November 2nd

Pick up will be scheduled for these days but due to unforeseen circumstances the pick-up may happen at any time during that week.

Brush Pick Up Rules:

Brush pick up will be done one day during the week. Starting at 7 a.m. Once the truck goes by it will not be back until the next scheduled pick up.

1. Place brush between the sidewalk and the road (or next to the pavement of the road if no sidewalk). None in the road or extending over the sidewalk.
2. Brush should not be placed by the road prior to the Friday preceding pick up.
3. Place brush with the cut end towards the road.
4. Brush must be piled neatly.
5. Brush may not exceed 5 inches in diameter and /or eight feet in length.
6. There shall be no garden waste (most garden waste can be cut in 6 inch strips and picked up with leaf pick up).
7. There shall be no lumber, roots, concrete, stones, poison ivy or feces mixed with the brush.

The Village will be flushing hydrants – May 18th, if you notice that your water is dirty/filmy – just run your cold water for a few minutes to clear your service lines. Flushing is mandatory and it will clear stagnate water out of the system.

Spring Reminders:

- **If you have delinquent utility bills prior to December 31, 2019 or any delinquent code enforcement balances, they WILL be placed on the 2020 tax bill as of June 1, 2020. Village 2020 tax bills will be out by July 1.**
- Chapter 71 of the Village Code of Ordinances prohibits the use of skateboards, bicycles, rollerblades, etc. on any public sidewalk on Main St. between Cherry St. and Chestnut St. on the East side and between Cherry St. and the Municipal Parking lot on the West side. Also use on Grand River Ave. between Clark St. and Howard St and in any municipal parking lot is prohibited.
- Any noxious weeds higher than 8 inches in height are a violation of Chapter 91 of the Village Code of Ordinances.
- Please be kind to your neighbors and your community by cleaning up after your pets, keeping them on a leash and keeping them on your property.
- **The Village of Webberville Village Office and DPW will be closed for Memorial Day, May 25, 2020.**
- Time for spring cleanup – Make sure you call Granger for any large pick-ups at 517-372-2800.
- View Village Ordinances at the website – find ordinances in the middle of the home page. You may want to check for junk/junk vehicles/road way parking/zoning/building issues or recreational burning. These can all be found if you type in the search engine what you are looking for. The website will say American Legal Publishing.
- **The Ingham County Drain Commission is starting the last phase of the Webberville Project next week with some video taping of construction areas, construction staking and the contractors equipment will be mobilizing starting in the next week or so. A website will be available for this project on or before May 11th – to view project progress and highlights, work areas for the upcoming week and the ability to communicate with the Engineer about any concerns. The village of Webberville will be placing a link to the website under the other tab of our new website and will have a copy of the letter sent out on the homepage. The Village Office will also have magnets that have the contact information for this project. PLEASE keep in mind that the Contractors will be trying to avoid contact with the residents of the village due to the Coronavirus – so the ICDC, the Village, the Engineers and the Contractors are encouraging you to watch the website or call the engineers or Village Office for information, questions or concerns.**

The Village is in the process of getting their website revamped – please be patient with them until the transformation is complete.
