A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A REQUEST FOR FUNDING, DESIGNATE AN AGENT, ATTEST TO THE EXISTENCE OF FUNDS TO CARRY OUT VARIOUS INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND COMMIT TO IMPLEMENTING A MAINTENANCE PROGRAM FOR INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDED BY THE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Webberville, Ingham County, Michigan, held in the Village Hall, 115 S. Main Street, in said Village, on August 12, 2014 at 6:30 PM.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by _____, and supported by Commissioner _____.

WHEREAS, the Safe Routes to School program, a federally funded program administered in Michigan by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT).

WHEREAS, the Village of Webberville, in partnership with Webberville Community Schools, is applying for funds through MDOT from the Safe Routes to School program to construct certain infrastructure projects throughout the Village, including sidewalks and crosswalks, to enable and encourage children to safely walk and bike to school.

WHEREAS, MDOT requires a formal commitment from the public agency that will be receiving these funds and will be implementing and maintaining these infrastructure projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Village has authorized Christopher Khorey, Village Planner from McKenna Associates, to act as agent on behalf of the Village to request Safe Routes to School funding, and has authorized Brad Hitchcock, Village President, to act as the applicant's agent during the project development, and to sign a project agreement upon receipt of a funding award.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Village attests to the existence of, and commits to, the funds necessary to carry out the project, including engineering for design and construction, permit fees, administration costs, and cost overruns.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Village commits to owning operating, funding and implementing a maintenance program over the design life of the facilities constructed with Safe Routes to School funding.

**VILLAGE OF WEBBERVILLE
NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY STATEMENT**

The Village of Webberville reaffirms its policy to allow all individuals the opportunity to participate in federal financially assisted services and adopts the following provision:

“No person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.” In applying this policy, the Village and its sub-recipients of federal funds shall not:

1. Deny any individual with any service, opportunity, or other benefit for which such individual is otherwise qualified;
2. Provide any individual with any service, or other benefit, which is inferior (in quantity or quality) to, or which is provided in a different manner from that which is provided to others;
3. Subject any individual to segregated or disparate treatment in any manner related to such individual's receipt of services or benefits;
4. Restrict an individual in any way from the enjoyment of services, facilities or any other advantage, privilege or other benefit provided to others;
5. Adopt or use methods of administration, which would limit participation by any group of recipients or subject any individual to discrimination;
6. Address any individual in a manner that denotes inferiority because of race, color, or national origin;
7. Permit discriminatory activity in a facility built in whole or in part with federal funds;
8. Deny any segment of the population the opportunity to participate in the operations of a planning or advisory body that is an integral part of a federally funded program;
9. Fail to provide information in a language other than English to potential or actual beneficiaries who are of limited English speaking ability, when requested and as appropriate;
10. Subject an individual to discriminatory employment practices under any federally funded program whose objective is to provide employment;
11. Locate a facility in any way, which would limit or impede access to a federally-funded service or benefit.

The Village of Webberville will actively pursue the prevention of any Title VI deficiencies or violations and will take the necessary steps to ensure compliance. If irregularities occur in the administration of the program's operation, procedures will be promptly implemented to resolve Title VI issues all within a period not to exceed 90 days.

The Village of Webberville designates Jaymee Hord, Village Clerk/Treasurer as the Title VI Coordinator. The Clerk/Treasurer will be responsible for initiating and monitoring Title VI activities and other required matters, ensuring that the Village of Webberville complies with the Title VI regulations and pursues prevention of Title VI deficiencies or violations.
