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2022 Fall Leaf Collection Guidelines

Leaf pickup will be done one day during the week depending on weather. To ensure pickup, have your leaves out to the street by Monday at 7:00 a.m. Once the truck has gone by your house, it will not pick up again until the next scheduled pickup day.

We will try our best to adhere to this schedule but sometimes unforeseen circumstances or weather may not allow it.

Please follow these simple instructions for leaves:

1. Rake leaves to the edge of the street, not in the street. If we cannot reach them with the vacuum hose, we will not be able to pick them up.
2. Do not make leaf piles wider than (4') four feet wide or we cannot reach them all.
3. Do not rake leaves around posts, signs, mailboxes, or cars. Keep them at least (4') four feet away from all objects.
4. Do not pile them at intersections where we will have to block traffic to pick them up.
5. Do not mix trash, sticks, rocks, or other debris with leaves as it will cause damage to the leaf vacuum and/or injury.
6. Do not pile brush and leaves together we cannot sort it for you.
7. Do not put leaves in bags; we do not pick up bags.



§ 92.15 SNOW REMOVAL REQUIRED.

The occupant of any premises in the village, which includes any house, store, building, or lot, upon which there is located a public sidewalk, shall remove or cause to be removed from the sidewalk ice and snow subject to the following requirements.

(A) All snow and ice shall be removed within 24 hours after it has ceased if the accumulation is less than four inches.

(B) All the snow and ice shall be removed within 48 hours after it has ceased if the accumulation is more than four inches.

§ 92.16 NEGLECT TO REMOVE SNOW; PROCEDURE.

Should any owner or occupant of any premises subject to this subchapter neglect or refuse to remove the snow and ice from the public sidewalk as provided in § 92.15, the Village President or designee shall remove, or cause to be removed, all the snow and ice at the owner's expense, which charge shall constitute a special assessment and payable as provided in § 92.17.
